Notice is hereby given that at 10:00 o'clock a.m., on the 1st day of November, 2011 at the City Council Chambers, City Hall, 121 North LaSalle Street, Chicago, Illinois, a public hearing will be held by the Committee on Finance of the City Council of the City of Chicago to consider the creation of an area within the City of Chicago, designated as Special Assessment Area Number 32 (the "Area"), and the authorization to be levied in tax years 2011 through and including 2020. The purpose of creating the Area shall be to provide special services within the Area, which may include, but are not limited to: recruitment of new businesses to the Area, rehabilitation of the Area, and other business and beautification activities, new construction, security, coordination of promotional and advertising activities, strategic planning for the Area, and other financial assistance activities to promote commercial and economic development (which may include, but are not limited to, enterprises improve-ments, strategic transportation improvements including parking management studies, and enhanced and use oversight and control initiatives), which will be hereinafter referred to collectively as the "Special Services."

At the hearing there will be considered a Service Tax to be levied against the taxable property included within the Area for the Services of the Special Services. The Service Tax shall be in addition to all other taxes provided by law and shall be levied pursuant to the provisions of the Property Tax Code, 32 ILCS 200/1-1 et seq., as amended from time to time.

The Area shall consist of the territory described herein and incorporated hereto as Exhibit 1. The approximate street location of said territory consists of both sides of 51st Street from Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive on the east side to the Metra Railroad tracks on the west side.

At the public hearing any interested person, including all persons owning taxable real property located within the proposed Area, notified by the creation of the Area and the levy of the Service Tax may file with the City Clerk of the City of Chicago within objections to and may be heard orally with respect to any issues embodied in the notice. The Committee on Finance of the City Council of the City of Chicago shall hear and determine all protests and objections so filed and, and the levy of the Service Tax shall be adjusted to another date without further notice other than a motion to be entered upon the minutes of the meeting of the Committee on Finance of the City of Chicago. If a petition signed by at least fifty-one percent (51%) of the landowners included within the boundaries of the proposed Area objecting to the creation of the Area and the levy of the Service Tax therein is filed with the City Clerk of the City of Chicago within sixty (60) days following the final adjournment of the public hearing, the Area shall not be created and the Service Tax shall not be levied.



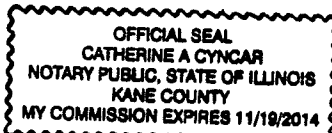
